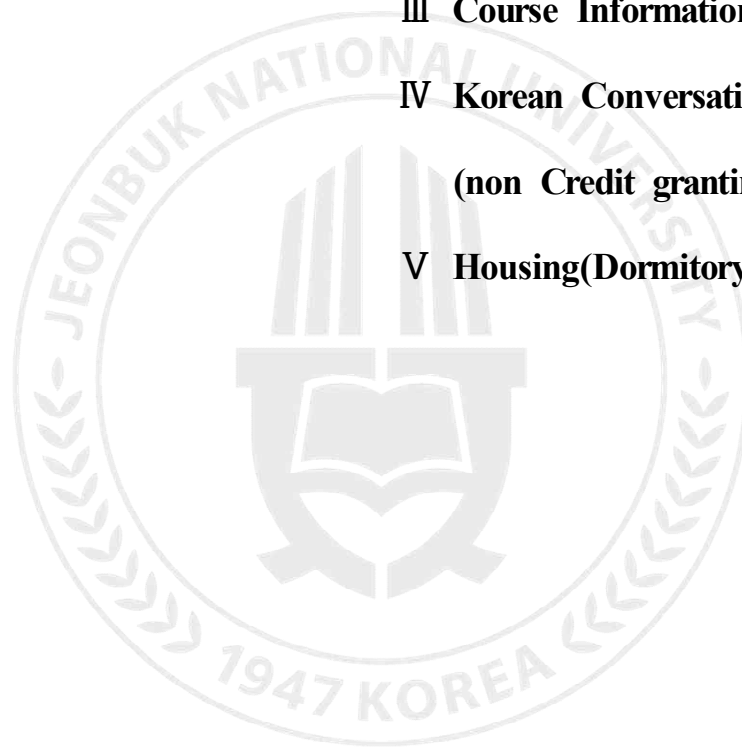

<b>Maximum Applicants per University</b>	<b>30 Students</b>
<b>Eligible Students</b>	Students must first be nominated by their home universities. Undergraduate and Graduate students are eligible to apply. However, graduate students are required to provide a letter of recommendation from a JBNU faculty member with their application.
<b>Duration of Exchange</b>	One or Two semesters.

<b>Language Proficiency Requirements</b>	<p><b>None.</b></p> <p>Students with Korean language proficiency may enroll in any courses taught in Korean (TOPIK Level 3 recommended).</p> <p>All students are welcome to enroll in Korean language classes or in courses taught in English.</p>
<b>Required Documents</b>	<p>Completed Application Form</p> <p>Letter of Recommendation from home university (English)</p> <p>Certificate of Enrollment (English)</p> <p>Transcript (English)</p> <p>Study Plan / Statement of Purpose (Korean or English)</p> <p>A photocopy of the student's passport</p> <p>3 photos of the student (3.5cm×4.5cm, white background)</p>

<b>Enrollment Minimums and Maximums</b>	<p>Courses at JBNU typically award 3 credit hours.</p> <p><b>Undergraduate Student</b> Minimum-Maximum enrollment per semester: <b>6-18 credit</b></p> <p><b>Graduate Student</b> Minimum-Maximum enrollment per semester: <b>3-9 credit</b></p>
<p>***Course tuition fees are waived for exchange students.</p> <p>***General Korean Language classes are not offered to graduate students.</p>

## Korean Conversation Course(non credit granting)

<b>Course Description</b>	<p>This special course is offered to undergraduate and graduate students at various Korean proficiency levels (1- 5) and does not grant university credit.</p> <p>It aims to improve students' Korean language skills through the discussion of various topics related to everyday life and to enhance students' understanding of Korean culture.</p>
<b>Course Fee &amp; Schedule</b>	<p>450,000 KRW / semester</p> <p>70 hours of instruction are offered in Spring and Fall semesters for one hour per day over 14 weeks.</p>

## University Housing[Dormitory]

<b>Chambit Dormitory</b>	<p>Exchange students are guaranteed dormitory placement at Chambit Dormitory if they request it.</p> <p>Dormitory fees include accommodations and 3 meals per day(Mon to Fri).</p> <p>Dormitory rooms are double occupancy with private bathrooms.</p> <p>Dorm amenities include a fitness room, computer lab, reading room, lounge, and laundry room.</p>
<b>Dormitory Fee</b>	<p>About 1,300,000 KRW / semester, <b>including 3 meals from Monday to Friday</b></p>
<b>Off-campus Housing Assistance</b>	<p>Do not provide off-campus housing assistance.</p>
<b>Payment Deadlines</b>	<p>Spring Semester: End of January</p>
